2025 Ontario Indoor Championships
and Winter Pistol Wrap Up Match
April 5,6,12,13,19,20 + Club nights

Overall, these Championships will be similar to 2024. Glynn Loftin will be convenor of Kitchener, Danielle Belanger will be convenor of Ottawa, Port Elgin will have Joe Struys as Coordinator, Owen Sound will have Dave Fritz as Coordinator and Harold Frey will be Coordinator in Galt. John Campeau will be local Coordinator for the Burlington matches. Bryan McKellar will be the convenor at the Peterborough Club. ISSF and Sporting Rifle events will be fired at Pioneer, Ottawa, Burlington and Peterborough. Hunting and Silhouette events will be conducted at Port Elgin, Owen Sound and Galt.

Electronic Target: Depending on the entry numbers an Electronic Target Champions will be declared in ISSF Prone and ISSF Air Rifle.

All Shooter Note: All competitors in ISSF, Sporting Rifle events MUST BE members of OnTarget. OnTarget will be offering Indoor and Outdoor Championships this year so membership or PQRA Federation Quebecois de Tir. See entry form below.

ISSF Shooters Note: Electronic and Paper targets may be used for the Indoor Championships. Male and Women's events are now separate for 3 position, air and Air Pistol. **All ISSF event are now 60 shots in length.** Electronic target users can consult with Doug Ratcliffe for event times.

Awards: A Provincial Champion plaque will be awarded to the top competitor in each event. Winners can be from any class. Provincial Champions are not eligible for class awards. Medals will be awarded for classes indicated. Second and third place awards will be awarded based on numbers of each event. Second will be awarded if 3 or more are in any given class and a third place medal will be awarded if 5 or more are in that given class. (We reserve the right to combine classes if a match has more than one class with only one or two competitors.)

Classifications and Timings:

1. Note: targets from postal competitions MAY NOT BE USED in these Championships.
2. SFC rules and classifications will apply to ISSF and Sporting Rifle events.
3. Shooters without a current classification will shoot in Temporary Expert class. Please have your classification card handy if needed.
4. For Current SFC rules a Sporting Rifle Jr is a shooter who has not reached his/her 16th birthday by Dec 31, 2025. An Intermediate/International Jr. (both Sporting and ISSF Rifle) is a shooter who has not reached (his/her) 21st birthday by Dec 31, 2025. Juniors must indicate date of birth on the entry form.
5. A Veteran is a shooter who is 55 years of age or older January 1, 2025.
6. Classification of Hunting Rifle and Silhouette events will be based on Winter LSBA scores or as prescribed by the location Convenor.
7. As mentioned above all ISSF and Sporting Rifle competitors must be members of OnTarget Rifle and Pistol Alliance or the Federation Quebecois de Tir. Membership in the Shooting Federation of Canada is not mandatory but is strongly recommended. Membership in the SFC is required to validate a classification card.
8. ISSF Prone and 3 Position events will be as usual but, 3 Position events are now 20shots.
SHOTS PER POSITION ARE NOT 40 SHOTS FOR MEN AND WOMEN.

paper times are:

35 minutes for 20 shots kneeling

30 minutes for 20 shots prone

40 minutes for 20 shots standing

electronic times are:

prone-15 minutes preparation and sighting-in time plus 50 minutes for 60 shots prone.

3 pos-15 minutes preparation and sighting-in period - for kneeling 35 min, target change, 30 min for prone, target change and 45 min for standing stage.

All stages of events are to be fired on consecutive relays. In special cases where there may be a break down of equipment this rule maybe waved, only if range time is available and time permits. There will be no doubling up of match scores. Each match is a separate event.

9. Air Rifle and Air Pistol events have the following time limit. 90 minutes for 60 shots. Electronic Target time limit is 15 min preparation and sighting in time and 75 min time limit.
10. Sporting Rifle time limits are straight 30 minutes for all three positions. (Pr,St,Kn)

ISSF rules:

1. there will be no specific checks at these Championships. Spots checks may be done as matches are in progress. This includes rifles, accessories, and clothing.
2. equipment rules are based on current ISSF Rules. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure that his/her equipment complies with current rules. If in doubt have your equipment checked out before the match begins. Illegal equipment may result in a DQ.

Sporting Rifle rules:

1. All rifles will be checked before shooting starts for weight (overall 4 kg max) and a trigger pull of (1 kg)
2. Rifle dimensions must conform with the SFC Rulebook. Rifle dimensions will not be checked at weigh-in but we will spot check any rifles that appear questionable as the match progresses. If a spot check fails to meet regulations the score maybe disqualified.

Hunting Rifle rules:

The SFC rules for Hunting Rifle were published on Page 29 in AIM Spring/Summer 2004

Reservations: With squadded matches such as these, advance entries are very important if you wish to have a reserved spot for yourself. On your entry form indicate 1st and 2nd choices of squad. Consecutive squads are not required for ISSF 3 position events. All advance entries will be confirmed if possible.

For multiple events reduction of \$2 per event for Seniors, \$1 per event for Jrs.
All other events - fee will be set by range coordinators similar to Winter LSBA

If more than one event is being entered the first event will be full value. All subsequent events will have a \$2.00 reduction for Seniors and a \$1.00 reduction for Juniors. For example if Events 1, 3, 4 and 5 are entered the total fees would be \$74.00 instead of the full value of \$80.00. In all events the reduced entry for Juniors applies only if the shooter is competing for Junior awards. In order to be eligible for the classification awards as well as Junior they must pay the same rate as a Senior; this fee makes the Junior eligible for both classification and Junior awards.
